

STIPULATIONS

1. Cultural Resources:
Any cultural and/or paleontological resource (historic or prehistoric site or object) discovered by the contractor, or any person working on their behalf, on public or Federal land shall be immediately reported to the Authorized Officer. The contractor shall suspend all operations in the immediate area of such discovery until written authorization to proceed is issued by the Authorized Officer. An evaluation of the discovery will be made by the Authorized Officer to determine appropriate action to prevent the loss of significant cultural or scientific values. The contractor will be responsible for the cost of evaluation and any decision as to proper mitigation measures will be made by the Authorized Officer after consulting with the contractor.
2. Invasive, Non-Native Species:
Areas disturbed as a part of this project will be monitored by BLM specialists for two growing seasons to insure that no invasive species become established on the site.
3. Wastes (Hazardous and Solid):
The project inspector will provide monitoring of the operation to assure that the contractor abides by rules for refueling equipment and spill containment.
4. Recreation:
Harvest and heavy equipment use will be restricted to the hours of 0800-1600 Monday through Friday. Closure signs will be posted on the affected area during operations to prevent conflicts with recreational users.
5. Vegetation:
The project inspector will be present on site during the harvest and thinning operations to ensure that the contractor operates only within the prescribed boundaries of the project, and that unnecessary damage does not occur.
